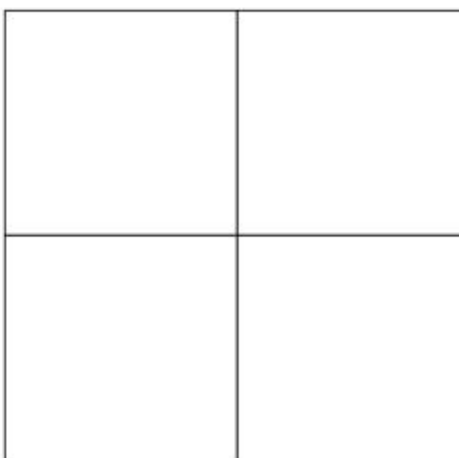
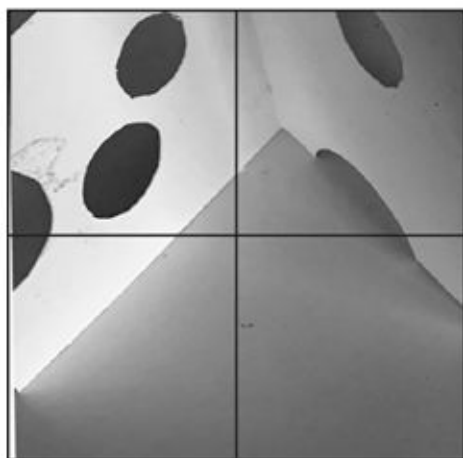

SPACE and VALUE

When sketching it is important to measure and be aware of both positive and negative space and have smooth gradation of value.



Lightly draw the negative space of the image on the left into the box on the right. Once you are confident your image is drawn to scale, use thin layers of pencil to build up your values. Use the value scale above to help you determine how dark a value is. Make sure your values transition slowly into one another and look at the edge where one value transitions into the rest. It should be a smooth fade in areas where the value transitions from dark to light.



Make sure you are using VALUE to define your edges. NO OUTLINES

Notice the circles are not perfectly round because they are on an angle

TIP: Use light pressure and many layers to build up darks. No sketchy lines in your shading?

When drawing, always look at and measure the object on the page and the space around the object before adding details and shading.

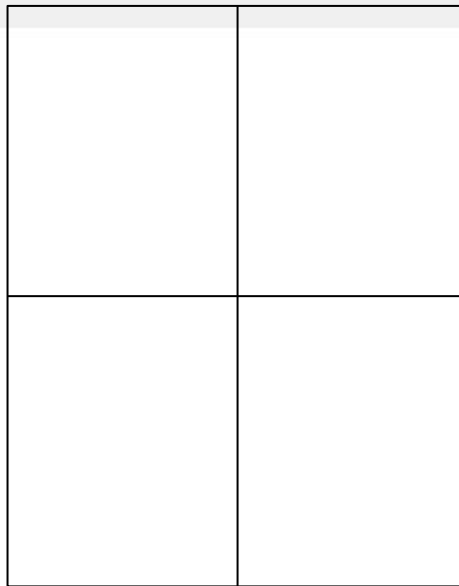
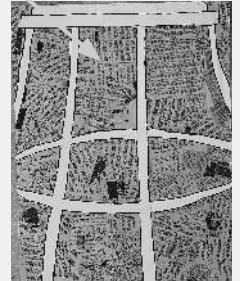
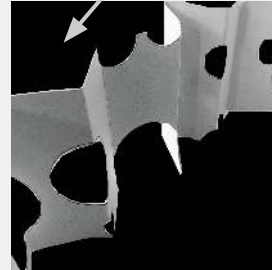

NEGATIVE SPACE

IS THE SPACE AROUND YOUR SUBJECT MATTER.

In the box on the right, draw the **NEGATIVE** spaces of the object in the photo on the left. Use the guidemarks to help you measure and draw to scale. Make sure the space around the object is accurate.



Once you are sure your spaces are drawn accurately darken the negative space with your pencil. Your positive space will remain white and your negative space will be shaded.

Look at the shape of the space around the object and not the object itself.

Use the grid to help make sure your negative spaces are drawn in the right place on the page.

Various Graphite Techniques

There are several ways to apply graphite pencil:

- Hatching



- Cross-Hatching

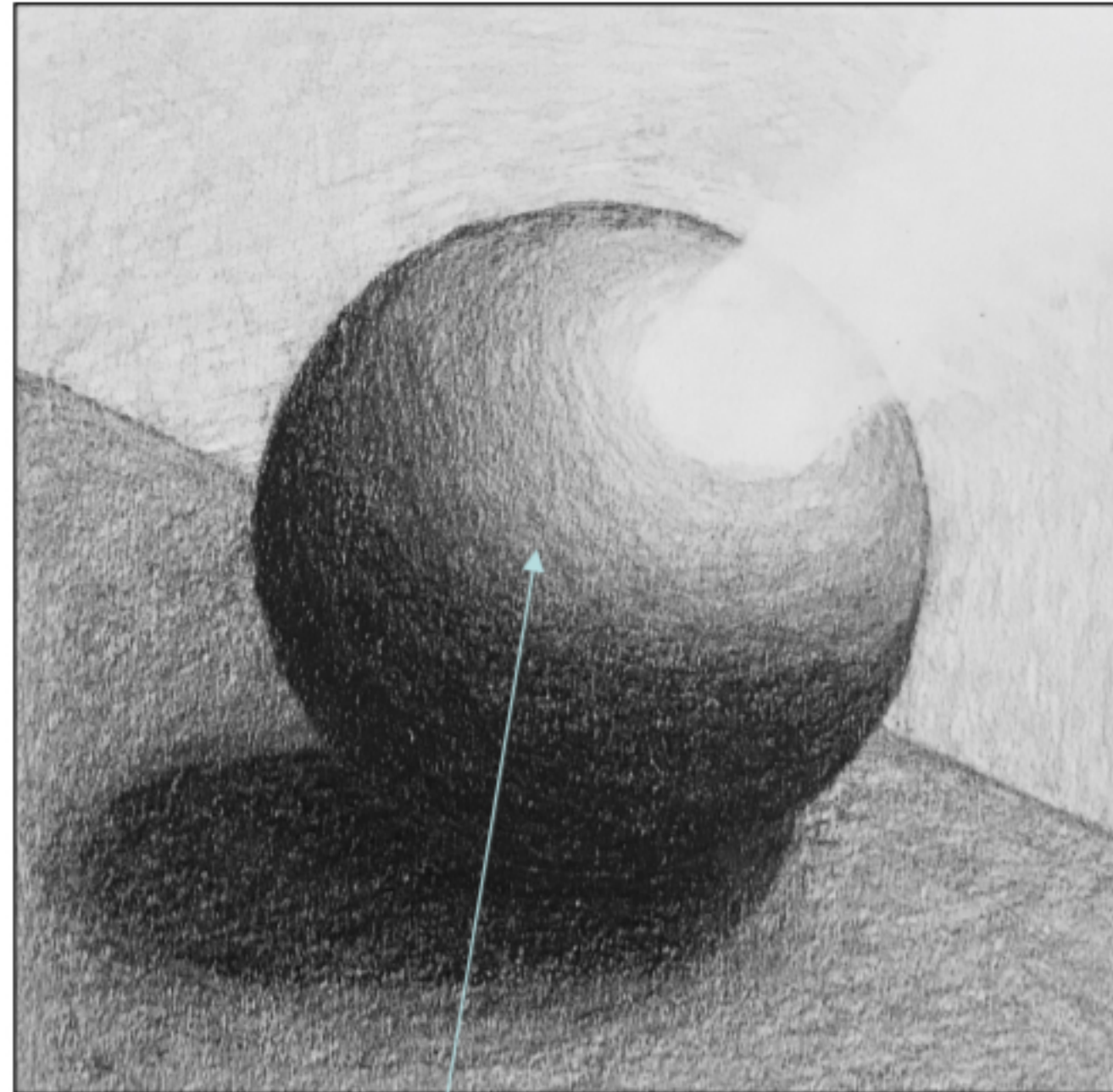


- Circular Motion



- The circular motion is effective and the one I use for two reasons:

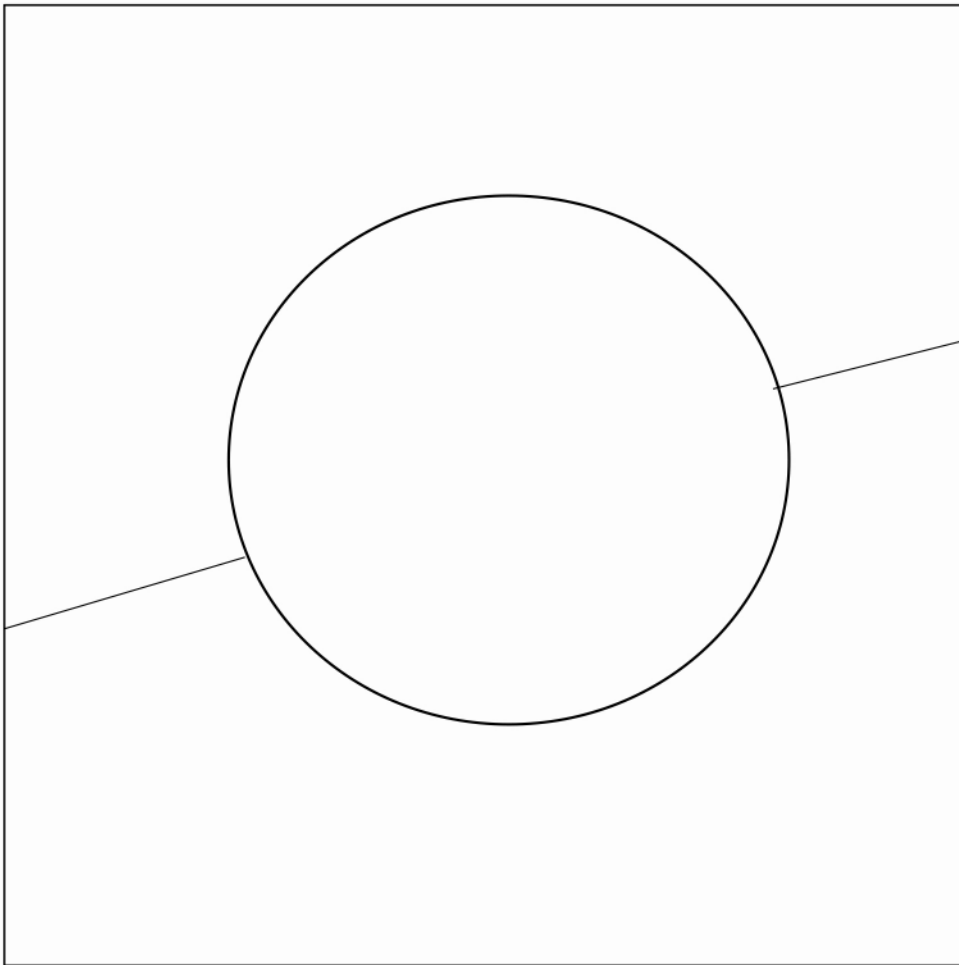
- 1. This motion allows for a smooth application of graphite pencil with no visible harsh lines. The technique is fabulous for creating realistic values and 3-dimensional objects.
- 2. This motion allows for an easy smooth transition of value without hard edges where they do not belong. As light areas transition to dark areas, these small circles create a nice even seamless layer of graphite
